Campership Policy

Definition: A Laketrails **campership** provides a portion of the camper fee for a session at Laketrails. It generally does not provide the full camper fee, but the full fee may be considered in appropriate cases.

I. Purpose of Policy

Laketrails has a special concern for serving the needs of teens who may not have the ability to pay the regular camping fees. We believe that the Laketrails experience is just as important to these teens as for those who can afford to pay the full fees. We also believe there is real educational value in sharing the camping experience with people from diverse backgrounds. By providing camperships we can be assured of the participation of a well-rounded group of teens in our program.

II. Determination

Camperships are determined on the basis of two main criteria:

- Financial need (using school lunch program criteria)
- Personal need (i.e. benefit to the individual teenager)

III. Distribution

- A. Camperships are given on a first come-first serve basis.
- B. Camperships are divided as evenly as possible between sessions, but may not be available for all sessions.
- C. Camperships are limited to funds available.
- D. Campership recipients are asked to do some volunteer service in their community to help "pay" for their award.

IV. Guidelines for Campership Recommendations

- A. Campership recommendations may be made by any interested party including: alumni, teachers, social workers, etc.
- B. Camperships are awarded by the Camp Director in consultation with committee.
- C. Because camperships are based on recommendations, it is essential that the person making a recommendation do the following:
 1. Know or get to know the individual you are recommending.
 2. Understand that camperships are offered only if funds and space are available.
 3. Help the teen/family complete an application. (It is important to know why the teen wants to attend camp, what the family's total income is, and how much they feel they can afford.)
 4. Complete & sign the recommendation section of the form.

V. Procedures

- A. Submit a completed application and a registration form to the Camp Director.
- B. Pay registration deposit. (The registration deposit may be reduced or waived if pre-authorized.)
- C. You will normally receive a response in 1-2 weeks.
- D. If accepted, complete a health history and physical exam form.
- E. Pay any additional fees by the appropriate date(s).
